Sandy Elementary teachers will gather and analyze data, make students accountable for their own learning, progress monitor, and do weekly/daily fluency reads

Classroom teachers, along with the school's achievement coach, worked together to present quality instruction following a curriculum map for reading. To inform this instruction, the coach and teachers, along with interventionists, perform various formative assessments, including progress monitoring and weekly and daily fluency reads to mark achievement. AIMSweb benchmark testing was also done to show achievement during three different times of the year.

Sandy Elementary will use AIMS benchmark assessments.

Sandy Elementary is a Title 1 School that receives additional monies from the federal government for use with academic programs in the school. With most of this federal money, the school pays for interventionists to work with students in reading. Obviously, we could have and should have used the extra LANDTrust money for an additional aide as we stated in our plan; however, we didn't because of the experienced and talented group of interventionists that we already had and were regularly using. Once the school year was up and going, and the aides were working, we did not make training a new interventionist a priority or a need.
